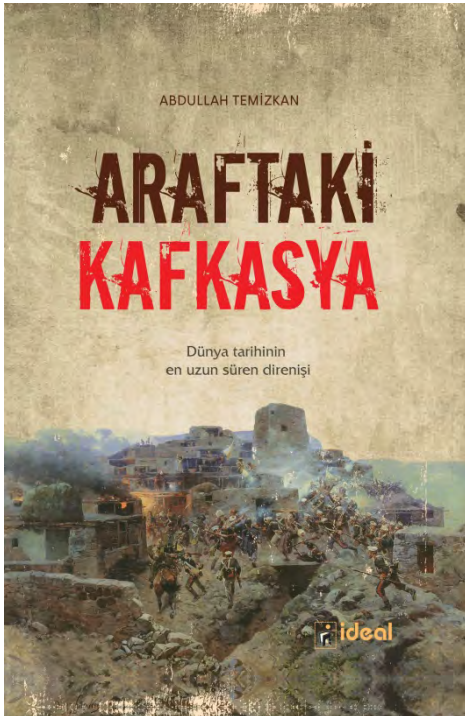

Caucasus In Purgatory

The freedom wars of the Caucasian people have always been the focus of international politics due to their geo-political position. In the 19th century, Russia, which was the regional powers except the Caucasus, was not between Iran and the Ottoman State, but also between Britain and France, the colonial powers of the world at the time. However, this power of Circassian issue consisted of a veil of fog created by the states in question for the Caspian Sea and the Black Sea in order to take advantage of the rich colonies in the Near and Far East.

The Caucasus in Purgatory, which is prepared with a Ottoman and Russian archive work, breaks this curtain of fog, between Russia, the Caucasian people and the Ottoman Empire happened in the invasion of these lands.

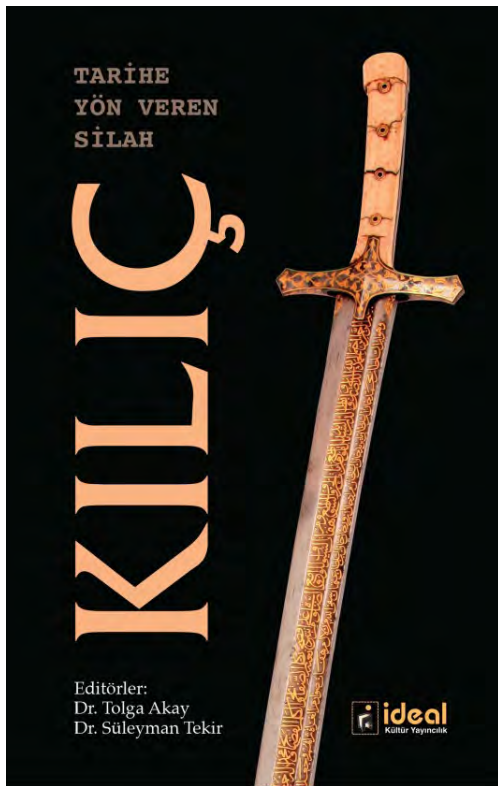
Nusayris is one of the religious minority groups lived in a certain geography as a population with its own cultural and social characteristics within the multicultural structure of the Ottoman Empire. Nusayris, who have been living in the region of the Mediterranean coast of Syria, they spread to Suveyda (Samandag), Antakya, Iskenderun and Cukurova regions from the second half of the century 18th. After the Ottomans sovereignty that are 400 years, the Nusayris today are living in Lebanese territory, mainly Syria and Turkey. In this Work, *named Nusayris in Ottoman Society*, The Nusayrî belief and the social structures of the Nusayri in the last period of the Ottoman Empire were discussed especially after Tanzimat, their socio-economic and cultural situations were focused on. Thus, it was tried to explain both the political and social histories of the Nusayris, who had an important place in the Ottoman mosaic, especially with their religious differences.

The Weapon That Shaped The History: Sword

This book is about the swords used in the lands where the Ottoman Empire dominated or neighbored. The place of swords in the Turkish system of belief and tradition, the production and use of swords in Central Asian Steppe culture, the swords on Turkish tombstones and the importance attributed to swords in ancient Turkish sources are some of the subjects addressed in the book. Sword production in the Ottoman Empire and the Republic of Turkey, sword workshops and craftsmen are examined. The last part of the book discusses important swords used in the Ottoman land and its neighbors. The technical features and production processes of Caucasian swords, Iranian Shamshir swords, Mameluke swords and European swords are among the subjects of this part. The book also tells about the arrival of the legendary Damascus steel in the Middle East and the production process of this sword in Damascus with its technical and historical aspects.

Tolga Akay, He has been working at Kafkas University since 2011. His fields of study are intellectual property rights in the Ottoman Empire, Caucasian migrations, horse breeding in the Ottoman Empire, and Ottoman swords.

Süleyman Tekir, he has been working as a Doctor Lecturer in History Department at Sinop University since June 2017. His fields of study are Military History, Immigration, Epidemic Diseases, Izmir Assassination Attempt, Swords in History, and Press History.

In Its Historical Process, Mosul and The Mosul Question

Mosul is an intersection point between Asia, Africa and Europe due to its geopolitical advantages. Although its geopolitical and strategic location, as well as fertile lands and underground riches, have been carefully preserved by the Ottoman Empire for centuries, the policies followed by the World War and after the Skyes-Picot Agreement made Mosul a bleeding wound in the Middle East.

This work aimed to highlight the importance of Mosul for centuries on the world map. The sequence of events that started from the Middle Ages and resulted in the Ottoman administration in the region and subsequently with the disposal of Mosul, was discussed in detail in this work, which is relatively rich in the Mosul problem. It is hoped that this work, which conveys the social life in Mosul by including the education and the titles about how Mosul women live, will contribute to the literature with deficiencies in Mosul history.

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The Ottoman History 1-2

The Ottoman Empire was a multinational, multicultural world state, where Turkish was used in official correspondence, which dominated three continents for more than six hundred years. This work contains information about Ottoman Culture and Civilization as well as a collective overview of Ottoman History. Ottoman History 1, covering the years 1299-1774, examines the political structure of the Ottoman State from the foundation period to the Küçük Kaynarca Agreement. In the second part of the work, the history of Ottoman Culture and Civilization was handled by academicians who are experts in their fields. In this section, developments in the field of establishment and rise period state understanding, Ottoman society, Ottoman financial structure, land and irrigation system, military structure and naval education were written.



In this volume of the work, the political events from Küçük Kaynarca to the period when the Ottoman Empire was withdrawn from the historical scene and Ottoman thought and science, Ottoman cultural developments, architecture, daily life, art and reforms were mainly discussed. With this feature, the work has the characteristic of being only a concise Ottoman political History and the History of Ottoman Culture and Civilization.

Selim Hilmi Özkan; he received a PhD in History from the Suleymen Demirel University (2006) and is a member of academicians names of the Yıldız Technical University in

Istanbul and held a post-doctoral position at the Texas Tech University Lubbock, TX, USA from 2014-2015. His research has focused on Ottoman diplomacy and Ottoman foreign policy.

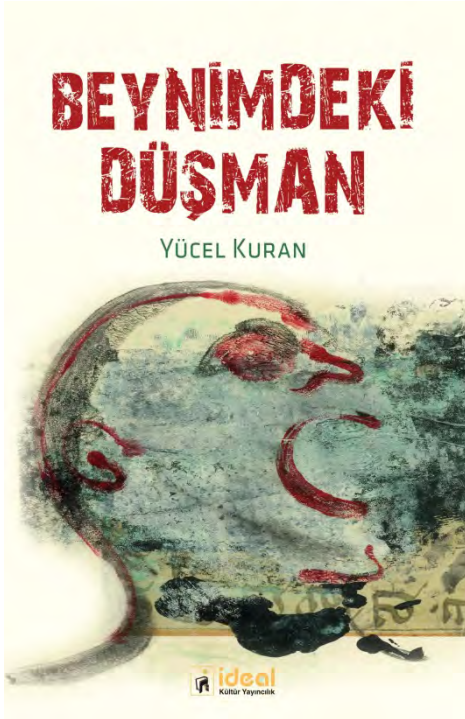
